

MOUNT PLEASANT TOWNSHIP
COLUMBIA COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA
ORDINANCE NO 15-1978

AN ORDINANCE prohibiting the parking of motor vehicles on Township roads during or after certain snow falls.

BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED, by the Mount Pleasant Township Supervisors:

SECTION 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to park any vehicle, tractor or trailer, or to allow the same to remain parked or unattended, on the paved or improved portion of any public highway in Mount Pleasant Township at any time during or after any snow fall when the depth of such snow fall exceeds one-half (1/2) inch or when icy conditions require the maintenance of such highways by Mount Pleasant Township.

SECTION 2 This Ordinance shall not apply to vehicles disabled due to mechanical failure or abandoned because of the inability to travel on such highways.

SECTION 3. No official sign shall be required for the enforcement of the provisions of this Article.

SECTION 4. Any person who shall violate any provisions of this Ordinance, shall, upon conviction thereof, be sentenced to pay a fine not to exceed THREE HUNDRED (\$300.00) DOLLARS and costs of prosecution or to undergo imprisonment for not more than THIRTY (30) DAYS for the nonpayment of such fine. No penalties shall be imposed upon a violator of any provisions of this Article for a first offense, however such violators shall be notified by certified mail, return receipt requested, of the first violation. No prosecution shall be brought against any violator for a second or subsequent violation thereof unless such violator had been notified by certified mail as aforesaid of such first or prior violation.

SECTION 5. The registered owner or owners of vehicles violating any provisions of this Ordinance shall be presumed to have parked or to have allowed to be parked such vehicle on Township highways in violation of this Ordinance.
