

Mount Pleasant Township Minutes of March 3, 2014

The Supervisors of Mount Pleasant Township held the regular monthly meeting on the above date. Chairman Fenstermacher called the meeting to order at 7pm. Those present: Supervisors Fenstermacher, Robbins, Gordner, and Secretary Kindt.

MINUTES

Minutes were presented for February 2014 meeting. Supervisor Gordner made motion to approve, seconded by Supervisor Robbins. Motion carried.

FINANCIAL REPORT

Financials were reviewed. Township received \$504 refund following Workers Comp audit. Supervisor Gordner made motion to approve financials, seconded by Supervisor Fenstermacher. Motion carried.

REPORTS

Road Foreman

-Approximately 114 hours plowing and cindering. Low on cinders. Will fill pot holes when cold patch is available.

Zoning Officer:

Not in attendance.

Community Center:

Security alarm sounded on Sunday. Secretary met State Police at the Center. Determined nothing was taken. Some images were caught on surveillance camera, but were not identifiable.

Secretary:

Nothing to report.

Correspondence:

Orangeville Baseball Association asked permission to use ball fields at Center. Supervisor Gordner made motion to approve, seconded by Supervisor Fenstermacher. Motion carried.

OLD BUSINESS:

None to discuss.

NEW BUSINESS:

-Secretary reported a settlement with Travelers Insurance for \$200,000 for costs incurred throughout the County when a change from Centax to Berkheimer was necessary. Money will be distributed by population. Berkheimer reduced their commission rate from 1.65% to 1.59% effective January 1, 2014. Township should receive \$7.36 refund for January commission.

-Resident Roberts sent a request for money to hold Easter Egg Hunt. Supervisor Gordner made motion to donate \$250, seconded by Supervisor Robbins. Motion carried.

PUBLIC PARTICIPATION:

-Some residents reported receiving letter from "Williams Proposed Pipeline" personnel. Supervisor Fenstermacher spoke with a representative who indicated Williams was meeting with the County Commissioners. The Township was not invited to attend that meeting. Supervisor Robbins suggested

residents form a group to deal with the issues. Township has not received any additional information to date.

-Supervisor Gordner indicated roads will be inspected to determine what work needs to be done. Work will not be bid through the COG due to prevailing wage guidelines. Bidding will be more competitive if done by the Township.

-Resident Black, Township EMA coordinator is working on several issues including truck radios and problems with 911 call center. Also, he is helping Supervisor Gordner compile a list of roads that cannot be used by emergency vehicles.

There being no further business for consideration, motion was made by Supervisor Fenstermacher, seconded by Supervisor Gordner to adjourn. Motion carried. Meeting adjourned at 7:25pm.
