The Supervisors of Mount Pleasant Township held the regular monthly meeting on the above date. Chairman Fenstermacher called the meeting to order at 7pm. Those present: Supervisors Fenstermacher, Wagner, Gordner, and Secretary Kindt.

MINUTES

Minutes were presented for August 2013 meeting. Supervisor Wagner made motion to approve, seconded by Supervisor Gordner. Motion carried.

FINANCIAL REPORT

Financials were reviewed. Additional check for approval to Postmaster \$92 for 200 stamps. Supervisor Gordner made motion to approve financials, seconded by Supervisor Wagner. Motion carried.

Secretary :

Secretary asked approval to attend seminar in November in Lycoming County. The State is revising account numbers which are used for audit purposes. Supervisor Fenstermacher made motion to approve, seconded by Supervisor Gordner. Motion carried.

Old Business:

Resident Sitler asked the purpose of the apologies made by two boys who had broken into the Center in February. Supervisor Wagner explained that the two boys who apologized were given probation; the two boys who did not apologize paid fines.

New Business:

-Resolution 78-13 Budget Amendment to move \$30,000 in reserve funds into budget. This was necessary due to the increase in fuel, materials and hauling. Supervisor Gordner made motion to approve, seconded by Supervisor Wagner. Motion carried.

-Motion was made by Supervisor Wagner to once again donate \$500 each to Millville, Orangeville, Buckhorn and Lightstreet Fire Companies. Supervisor Gordner seconded. Motion carried.

Public Participation:

Resident Sitler reported damage to his home after tar & chip on Peacock Corners Road. Sweeper threw stones onto his property. Supervisor Wagner will contact Jerry Brokenshire to resolve issue. There is a large excess of stone laying at the intersection of Peacock and Whites Church.

There being no further business for consideration, motion was made by Supervisor Wagner, seconded by Supervisor Fenstermacher to adjourn. Motion carried. Meeting adjourned at 7:10pm.
